As many of you know, Supervisor Jeff McKay will be transitioning out of his role in Lee District for, as we understand it, a Board leadership role. Jeff McKay has been an outstanding representative for our neighborhood and Lee District, and if you follow the local news you know how hard he's worked on behalf of the District and Fairfax County as a whole, serving on regional and state level commissions in addition to his daily Lee District responsibilities. Land Use Update

Summary of Land Use Meetings May - July 2018 (no meeting in August).

Oakwood Affordable Senior Housing

2019-IV-RH1: Comprehensive Plan Amendment to change plan language for County-owned land to permit development of an affordable residential complex senior citizens. This property is zoned R8, which permits 8 dwelling units per acre and is inconsistent with the plan language. Given consideration for building affordable housing (4x) and 20% for senior housing the developer could build up to 268 units; they plan to build 150 units.

Thanks to Elena Carroll and several residents of Piedmont, Jeff McKay established a task force of residents, county staff and the developer to discuss development of this property. The meetings provided residents the opportunity to discuss their concerns with this development on their properties and life style and for the developer to present their development objectives. These meeting resulted in the developer looking at some changes to the project.

A site walk also took place, again with a group of residents, county staff and the developer. This provided opportunity for the developer to see the topology of the residential properties that adjoin the development site. We looked at the residences from the development site and vice versa. As a result the developer indicated that they need to redesign the "legs" of the structure because they are closer to the current homes.

Prior to the site walk the developer presented this project to the Landuse Committee. The committee members had questions, but there was no serious opposition to this development at this time.



Despite the abundant green growth, it's likely that not every plant in your garden survived the standing water and swampy soils of 2018. Fortunately, the annual Garden Green Spring Gardens Day is just around the corner and Master Gardeners will be there to help with plant selections and gardening advice. This year the sale will take place on Saturday, May 18th. More than 40 vendors of rare and unusual plants from across the state will have booths set up for the popular event, which occurs during peak bloom for thousands of the park's

trees, shrubs and perennials.
